

# **CHAPTER INTERNSHIPS**

#### AAJA-MN/MN Newspaper Guild print internship

A print internship, co-sponsored by the Minnesota Newspaper Guild, at either the Star Tribune or Pioneer Press and a \$1,000 stipend. The host newspaper will decide the time period. 15-20 hours per week for 7-8 weeks. A \$5 voluntary Guild membership fee is suggested.

#### AAJA-MN TV or radio internship

An internship at a local television station and a \$1,000 stipend. Student must earn college credit for the internship, which is 15-20 hours per week for 8-10 weeks.

### ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must be an AAJA (Minnesota chapter) student member, or register to become a member before beginning internship. Applicants must be an undergraduate or graduate student enrolled full time with at least 12 credit units each semester (excluding summer). Applicants must be currently taking or planning to take journalism courses and/or are pursuing journalism as a career. Graduating seniors must begin their internships within three months of commencement.

### **SELECTION CRITERIA**

Candidates will be selected on the basis of academic achievement, demonstrated journalistic ability, commitment to the field of journalism and sensitivity to Asian American and Pacific Islander issues, as demonstrated by community involvement.

# HOW TO APPLY

Submit one (1) copy of each of the following items.

1) Completed application form

2) Resume

3) A letter of recommendation: This can be from a former editor or from a journalism professor.

4) Short essay: The essay should not exceed 500 words, must be typed and double-spaced. Describe any involvement or interest you have in the Asian American community. If you were awarded an AAJA scholarship or internship, propose how you would contribute to the field of journalism or media issues involving the Asian American and Pacific Islander community.

5) Work samples: We will not be able to return any work samples. *Print applicants:* Send up to four articles photocopied onto 8.5"x 11" paper. Journalism school assignments are acceptable, but we prefer published clips. *Photojournalism applicants:* Please submit a portfolio containing no more than 10 entries. A picture story is considered one entry. Published and unpublished photographs will be considered. Entries may be black and white, color prints, clippings, CDs or URLs. Complete caption information must be included along with the images. *Broadcast applicants:* Two writing or script samples.
